Rose is survived by her sons, Christopher J. Wlaz and wife Phyllis Heath, of Plainville, MA; Mark W. Wlaz and wife Deborah, of Sanibel, FL; and Gary A. Jordan, of Barrington, NJ; and her beloved nephew Eugene Sovira.
