Mrs. Thelma Irene Wells was born September 16, 1913 in Greencastle, PA. She is the daughter of the late Olive Mazie Rusco and George William Hamilton of Greencastle, PA. Thelma was one of nine children. She was affectionately known as "Tammy" to her family and friends. Wednesday morning, February 11, 2015, Thelma Wells found peace and heard a voice from heaven saying, "Come unto me and rest". She passed away at Manor Care Health Services. Thelma Wells, a jewel, was one hundred and one (101) years of age.

Thelma accepted Christ at an early age while attending Bethel AME Church, Greencastle, as a child. After her marriage, she moved to Chambersburg, PA, and joined St. James African Methodist Church, and for the next 85 years she was an invaluable member of the congregation. No one who met her ever forgot her.

Mrs. Wells volunteered many, many hours at the Chambersburg Senior Center. She was a member of the St. James African Methodist Church.

Thelma possessed a heart of gold. Her home was always welcoming. She loved her family and friends dearly. She always helped those in need. Her favorite scripture reading is Philippians 4:13 "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." That is true because she has done all things and continued to do all things until her health failed. She was a mother, cook, seamstress, factory worker, caregiver, ceramics maker, and leader. She loved to read, and with her excellent handwriting addressed and signed all holiday, birthday, and thank-you cards herself. She truly was "one in a million."

Thelma was married to the late Willimore A. (Gus) Wells and two children were born of

that union of 33 years, the late Carolyn (Kitten) Spraglin and the late Arthur A. (Boobie).
