Thomas "Tom" W. Ryan Jr., 92, of Chambersburg died on Wednesday, May 7, 2014 at Menno Haven Nursing and Rehab. Center. Born on February 28, 1922 in Chambersburg, he was the son of the late, Thomas W. and Bertha (Shatzley) Ryan.
