Dorothy Anna Uebbing Bucci, 83, passed away on November 16, 2021 at her home with her son Joe and daughter-in law Angela, by her side. She was born on October 20, 1938 at St. Ann's Hospital in Cleveland, Ohio to the late Omer William Uebbing and Myrtle Hall Uebbing.

Dorothy grew up in Cleveland, the oldest of three children including her two brothers, Donald Wilfred Uebbing of Nevada and Daniel Theodore Uebbing of Texas. She spoke fondly of her childhood in Cleveland, love of roller skating and enjoying the winter months and snow above all other seasons.

Dorothy first attended Notre Dame College in South Euclid, Ohio where she studied engineering. She later transferred to St. Francis University in Loretto, Pennsylvania and studied business. On April 4, 1964 in Cleveland, OH, she married James Vincent Bucci. Her first son, Joseph James Bucci was born in March 1965, followed by her second son, Michael David Bucci in July 1966. Dorothy worked at the Public Opinion and K-Mart in Chambersburg before retiring in 1998.

She had lifelong passion for animals and was a proud "dog mom" to several dogs throughout the years and most recently to Paul, who was her daily companion until his death on September 17, 2021. She had such a passion for dogs that she would foster dogs until homes could be found for them. An avid bird watcher, she also participated in several studies with the Audubon Society tracking birds in Pennsylvania.

Dorothy was a fiercely independent woman who raised her sons as a single
