



## Eleanor R. Hersh (Plotnick)

July 7, 1918 - June 13, 2014

CHAMBERSBURG – Eleanor Rose (Plotnick) Hersh, 95, of Chambersburg, died on Friday, June 13, 2014 at home, with her son by her side.

Born July 7, 1918, in Brooklyn, N.Y., she was the daughter of the late Iving and Nellie (Osder) Plotnick.

Eleanor and her husband, the late Max Hersh, owned and operated David's Half-Size Shop in downtown Chambersburg from 1963 to 1982. Max died in 1990.
