John P. Randolph, age 81, of Chambersburg, PA passed away on May 26, 2022 at the Menno Haven Memory Care unit of Chambersburg.

Born November 23, 1940, in Emmitsburg, MD, John was the son of the late John C. Randolph and M. Helen (Lingg) Randolph. His two sisters, Martha Austin and Diane Randolph reside in Emmitsburg, MD.

At a young age, John attended Mount Saint Mary's for two years before joining the U. S. Army.
