Karen E. Sioberg, 82, passed away Saturday, March 9, 2024, at the Chambersburg Hospital.

She was born February 28, 1942, in York, PA, the daughter of late Caroline and William Rebert.

A graduate of Gettysburg College in 1964 with a degree in Mathematics, Karen's professional career began with public school teaching in York Public Schools. She then became an economist at Chase Manhattan Bank in New York before transitioning to working as an economist at British Petroleum in London.

Upon her return to the states, Karen focused on building a family and had three children. The family moved to Chambersburg where she spent the next 30 years employed as a bookkeeper for Martin and Martin, Incorporated.

Karen was active in the community, serving as a deacon for the Presbyterian Church of Falling Spring. She also served on the board of the Chambersburg Council for the Arts, and supported the Cumberland Valley School of Music. Throughout her life, she was interested in gourmet cooking, loved music, and was committed to her children and grandchildren.

Karen is survived by her husband of 60 years, Charles Sioberg, three children Amy Frazier, Alan Sioberg, and Andrew Sioberg, four grandchildren and one great granddaughter.

Services will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, March 14, 2024, at the Presbyterian Church of Falling Spring with the Rev. Dr. Andrew Hart officiating. There will be a visitation one hour prior to the service at the church. Interment will be in the Falling Spring Graveyard immediately following the service.

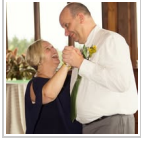
