Marian W. Schroyer, 85, of Chambersburg passed away on Sunday, November 30, 2014 at Menno Haven. She was born April 8, 1929, in Newport, Pa, the daughter of the late John Benjamin Wilson and Gladys (Cauffman) Wilson.

A 1947 graduate and valedictorian of Newport High School, she went on to receive her bachelor's degree from Shippensburg State Teachers College. She taught fourth grade at New Franklin Elementary School in 1951, when the building was new and remained teaching there for 32 years. She was a lifetime member of The Pennsylvania State Teachers Association, the Franklin County retired Teachers Association, and The National Education Association. In addition to teaching, Marion enjoyed playing the organ and piano and did so throughout high school and college.

She enjoyed traveling, had the opportunity to visited Europe twice and tour 11 countries. Marian had also visited all the States in the U.S except Alaska. Her husband of 63 years survives her, along with numerous nephews and nieces in West Virginia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, California, and Utah.
