Chambg. - Melvin E. "Bucket" Keltner, 89, died 1:45 p.m. Monday June 10, 2013 at home.

Born July 4, 1923 in Chambersburg. he was the son of the late James McFerren and Genevive Cramer Keltner Sr.

He was a member of the 1st Lutheran Church where he was on the property committee. He was also a veteran of WWII in the US Navy.
