



## Mr. Nicholas Benjamin Sollenberger

December 16, 1940 - July 9, 2021

Mr. Nicholas Benjamin Sollenberger, 80, of Chambersburg, died Friday, June 9, 2021, at Luther Ridge Retirement Community, Chambersburg. He was the husband of Mrs. Jeannie Sollenberger, his wife of 30 years.

Born December 16, 1940, in Chambersburg, he was a son of the late Glenn Harold, Sr., and Ruth Evelyn West Sollenberger.

In his earlier career, Mr. Sollenberger worked for Rife Motors, Chambersburg; but later became quite the entrepreneur founding and operating Nick's Hoagie Shop and Sollenberger's Messenger Service, both of Chambersburg.
