Chambersburg, PA - Ronald L. "Ronnie" Kanner, 72, of Chambersburg, died unexpectedly Sunday April 28, 2013 in Broward General Medical Center, Ft. Lauderdale, FL.

Ron was a 1959 graduate of C.H.S. and attended Shippensburg College in business.
