



## Rosemarie Corapi

October 1, 1933 - April 25, 2018

Rosemarie Corapi, 84, died April 25, 2018 in the Chambersburg Hospital. She was born October 1, 1933 in Brooklyn, NY, the daughter of the late Joseph and Anna (Horvath) Bentivegna. She attended St. Matthews Elementary School and Catherine McHauley High School in Brooklyn. Rosemarie married Eugene Corapi on June 3, 1956 at St. Matthews Catholic Church in Brooklyn.
