Winifred (Winnie) O. Helman, 95 of Chambersburg, passed away peacefully on January 22, 2020. She was born December 30, 1924, the daughter of Fred and Lettie (Statler) Overcash in Marion, Pa. Winnie was a 1942 graduate of Chambersburg Area High School. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, C.
